# CDS Welcomes David Moretz, DDS



I am humbled and excited about being chosen the large equipment manager for the Christian Dental Society. This is a huge responsibility and one that I take seriously knowing the consequences of failed dental equipment on a mission trip.

Presently, CDS has 12 working Aseptico Model ADU04-ST dental unitsand1underrepair. Theunitshaveanair/ watersyringe,hoses for high and slow speed handpieces, and high volume evacuation (suction). They are operated by compressed air. CDS has 8 110 Volt AA-98 AirPac II Asceptico air compressors and 2 under repair. We also have 1 220 Volt compressor with 1 under repair. In addition, the Society rents dental chairs invented by our own Dr. Gayle Cheatwood. These chairs are also available for purchase from CDS. All of this equipment can be viewed on our website christiandental.org.

Tina asked if I would share "my story" with the membership so folks could be comfortable contacting me if needed. I became a Christian in high school. After college I joined the Peace Corps and worked 2 years in agricultural extension in southern Nepal (10 miles from India). While there I noticed how much importance the Hindu people placed on their relationship with their gods, praying every morning at their home altars, and placing tikas on their forehands to signify their

worship. Their example spurred me to make my Christianity central to my everyday living and to develop a close personal relationship with my Savior. Being only about 50 miles from Lumbini Nepal (birthplace of Buddha), I visited the small village several times to pray and meditate on what direction God would have me go. There God spoke to me and said dentistry would be the way I should serve him. At that time the only communication with the outside world being sporadic mail service, I applied to one dental school and with God's recommendation, was accepted! I have been in private dental practice for 30 years in a dental shortage area in eastern North Carolina. I sold my practice 6 years ago but still work there 2 days a week. This gives me the time to serve the Lord through this avenue and others. Having been a member of CDS for at least 14 years (and a life member for 3), I am somewhat familiar with its "workings". In 1990 I went on my first short term dental mission trip and have been on 11 more through the years (3 to Mexico and 9 to Honduras) so I have a feel for the working conditions in developing countries.



I have rented equipment from CDS and also purchased a unit, compressor, and chair. Our teams usually consist of 2 to 4 dentists, 4 translators, and 4 "helpers/assistants. On our trips hoses have blown because of the tropical heat, water lines have stopped up because of particles in the water, compressors have burned out because of low voltage and inadequate amperes and on 1 trip 3 compressors were "lost" between Atlanta and home. Of course, I was responsible for those compressors and after 3 months of paperwork, the airline reimbursed me.



The key to short term mission trips is preparedness and flexibility. Preparedness includes taking a small tool kit with Allen wrenches to fit the screws in the units and compressors, a multi-tool device, small vise grip pliers, some 4 inch plastic ties, and duct tape. Flexibility includes changing direction in mid-stream. When my only compressor burned, the team helped the kids with crafts, spending more time teaching oral hygiene, and teaching a Bible class. Showing the Jesus film and giving a testimony may be what the Lord intended for you to do on your trip instead of dentistry.

When you rent CDS equipment you should expect it to be clean and in working order. An instruction sheet will be placed in each package concerning usage and maintenance. There is no guarantee the equipment will work on site because of rough transport, extreme conditions, or poor electricity. Last week I had tested a unit and it was working great. After being connected to the compressor for about an hour, a hose blew – temperature 101 degrees in eastern NC. It was easily repaired with the small tool kit. Several issues are common with this portable equipment: the compressors tend to overheat in tropical climates, voltage or amperes may be low and cause the breakers to flip, and the dental units use more air than those compressors can produce because of the HVE design. My assistant (of 30 years) has developed a rhythm to use the unit and compressor together – use the handpiece for 20 or 30 seconds, then use the HVE, observe the prep for a few seconds as the compressor is building up pressure, then back to the handpiece. That is about as efficient as this portable equipment will allow.

Before returning the equipment, please clean it and pack it securely. Let me know of any issues you have had with the equipment so they can be addressed before it is sent to the next team. I will unpack, clean and test the equipment before the next team receives it.

All of our equipment has been overhauled and is in some of the best shape it has ever been in.
