- 2. **Dr. Anthony and Dr. Naomi Wong, American, short-term missionaries since 1987,** have formed their own non-profit called Friends of Grace and will be our keynote speakers. They travel often to difficult-to-reach countries like Iraq, China, Myanmar, Thailand, Nepal and many others.
